A Message to our Valued Guest,

The health and safety of our guests and employees is of the utmost importance to us. During these troubling times, we at the Yankee Doodle Tap Room are hopeful that our bright future is just around the corner, yet we remain diligent in monitoring the developments related to the coronavirus. We assure you we have raised our typical standards of service, sanitation, and cleanliness and we are dedicated to providing a safe place for you and your family to enjoy a meal at your favorite downtown Princeton destination.

While the recommendations and guidelines from the CDC and New Jersey Department of Health are constantly evolving, we have been working diligently to ensure our safety and sanitation protocols not only meet those requirements but exceed our already high standards of service and hospitality.

Dine with the confidence of knowing the following procedures have been put in place to better protect our guests and employees:

- Distanced floor plans with tables 6 feet from one another on our outdoor patio only (no table will seat more than 8 guests)
- Required reservations of guests with a valid telephone number to control the capacity and keep good records for contact tracing purposes
- Increased cleaning and disinfecting frequency of all public spaces and surfaces including, elevators, handrails, doorknobs, etc.
- Readily available hand sanitizer stations
- Increased disinfection of top touchpoints including credit card machines, POS stations etc.
- Elimination of shared items, individual disposable items provided upon request, such as menus, napkins, condiments, salt and pepper etc.
- Suspended buffet and refill services, all food and beverage will be served on new clean and sanitized plates or glasses
- Enhanced cleaning and disinfecting of each dining area between guests, including tables and chairs (all seat cushions have been removed to provide a more sanitary surface to disinfect)
- Deployed use of electrostatic disinfectant sprayers between shifts to maximize sanitation efforts
- Increased signage and enforcement of social distancing protocols for our staff and guests including messaging regarding facial coverings and social distancing and an added shield providing a protective barricade between the host and guests
- Enhanced staff training in the new health and sanitation procedures including personal safety and social distancing measures to be adhered to with both guests and other employees in all public and work areas including but not limited to the dining area and kitchen
- Enhanced health and wellness measures for our employees including the use of personal protective equipment (masks and gloves), daily health evaluations and the use of touchless thermometers to check temperatures prior to each shift
- Continued adherence to all proper food handling protocols including Serv Safe certifications for all applicable staff
- Employ contactless ordering and delivery systems with vendors
